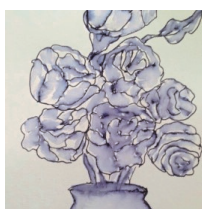

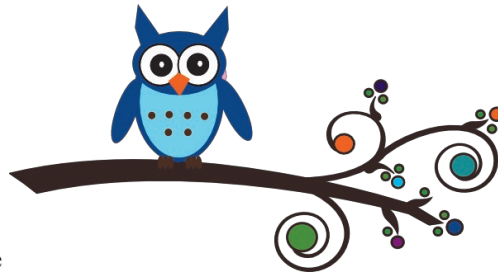

Preemptive Mayhem (2014) by **Dikran Chamlian** of Tiburon; a novel dedicated to all mentally and physically wounded and disabled soldiers, about a doctor in a Federal Medical Center in Germany who is committing crimes against patients.

Your Crystal Clear Career Path: featuring smart, new and effective job search strategies -- find rewarding work, not just a job! (2014). **Peter G. Engler** offers steps and a plan of action to get and keep fulfilling work.

Woman's Work: Making Quilts, Creating Art (2003), a video documentary by Tiburon resident **Charlotte Grossman**, delves into the lives of ten women who have made fabric and fiber art a major part of their lives.

Tech Training at the Library

We are your partners in learning and exploring new technologies. Whether you're updating your skills for a career change, or you just want to troubleshoot your computer or gadget, we are here to help.

Digital Download appointments

You probably know that the Library offers eBooks, eAudiobooks, and online magazines to download to a smartphone or tablet. If you need help using these services, librarians are happy to set up an appointment to get you started. Visit the *Go Digital* page in our website to schedule a session.

Wednesday Workshops

Most Wednesdays at 6:30 or 7:30pm, we offer a tech workshop on a wide variety of topics. In the past year, we've offered Photoshop Elements, Mac Basics, Pinterest, Facebook, Creating Safe Passwords and Evernote, to name a few. Every six months we repeat our MS Office training on Word, Excel, and PowerPoint.

We invite suggestions. As long as we can find a trainer and have the relevant software, we'll consider setting up a workshop. Make a comment or suggestion on the "contact us" section of our *About Us* page. Check the *Go Digital* page to sign up for workshops. Workshops begin again in September.

Netsharks

The Netsharks are a group of knowledgeable volunteers who offer free one-on-one beginner training sessions in the Library. They can help you set up an email account

or learn the basics of Web Navigation. Each session lasts one or two hours. We do our best to match you with a volunteer with the expertise in the topic you want to learn more about.

Mastering Tablets and Smartphones Special Interest Group

We build partnerships in the community to create more learning opportunities for you. Through our partnership with the Golden Gate Computer Society we have been able to offer additional sessions for those interested in unlocking the inner secrets of their mobile devices. Artists retrieve their work

Guidelines:

- Art needs to be two dimensional and able to be hung.
- Selected works should be available for sale. The Library retains 25% of the sales proceeds.

What to bring:

- Include your name, address, phone number, and email
- Show history
- Art education
- Photos of your work (no slides)
- One framed original

Take the Bus to the Library

This year the #219 bus provided a great after school service by shuttling kids directly from Bel Aire and Del Mar schools to the Library, and this summer the #219 will continue to have the same 7 day, 7:30 am to 7:30 pm service that can enable children to come to the Library. The bus travels from downtown Tiburon to the Strawberry Village Shopping Center and back and runs on a schedule approximately every 30-35 minutes along Tiburon Boulevard (40-45 minutes at high traffic times during the school year.) The cost is \$1.00 each way for young people ages 6 to 18. Summer is a wonderful time to enjoy the Library, and there are lots of special programs for kids.

Check the weekly ARK or call 415-256-8832 or 511 toll free for the #219 daily schedule. (Note that due to current construction at the stop across from the Library, it may be easier for children to continue riding downtown, and back to the bus stop directly in front of the Library.)
