
Girls Who Code is returning for the 2016/2017 academic year! We are happy to bring back our volunteer instructor,

#### **Book Donations**

Corner Books and the Library depend on donations from our local community to provide good quality books, DVDs, music CDs, and audiobooks to add to the collection or to sell in support of the Library's collection. Due to a lack of storage space for these items,



however, we ask that donors limit their donations to two bags or boxes per week, and that they drop off donations during open hours at either Corner Books or the Library in containers they do not need back.

Preferred items should be in good to new condition:

- Fiction and mystery, both hardcover and softcover, published since 2011
- Nonfiction books of general interest
- CDs, DVDs, and audiobooks that are intact and working

Please note the items we cannot accept:

- Books that are moldy, musty, damp, warped or have handwriting in them
- Magazines, VHS tapes, catalogues, out of date nonfiction books such as textbooks, computer, weight loss or business books

We are also unable to pick up books from donors' homes, but see below for a new drop-off location. All donations are tax deductible. Thank you for your donations!

# Something from Nothing 3D Printing is Here!

We have a 3D printer! Can you believe it? We have so many ideas of what we can create together. We'll be offering classes to help you get started and we plan to livestream your prints so you can get live updates!

You can create your own designs by using a CAD software like 123D or Cura, both of which you can access at the Library or download for free to your computer at home. We also offer access to the Autodesk Suite for free at the Library. Or, you can download ready-made designs online from sites like Thingiverse.



At first you'll want to print anything and everything. But we need to keep the prints under 2 hours. So make your designs small. Think prototypes. Reserve the 3D printer station before you come in with your designs. Unfortunately, right now, the printer has to take a break on Sundays. We'll help you upload the files to the 3D printer and choose the right color for your print. So - bring your designs and prototypes and get a free 3D print from the library!
