

# from the Reference Desk

## News and Reviews to Peruse as you Choose (for free!)

**Consumer Reports:** The Library now offers a new and improved online version of *Consumer Reports*. Accessible from inside the Library and at home, the new *Consumer Reports* interface allows you to search for individual products by name or browse different product categories, which can be arranged and filtered according to criteria such as price and overall score. It is continuously updated with the newest reviews, current trends and technologies, and can be accessed on the Library's website under the *Do Research* heading as well as at the address:  
[beltlibrary.org/resource/consumer-reports](http://beltlibrary.org/resource/consumer-reports). This version of *Consumer Reports* even works on your mobile phone or tablet, allowing you to compare products while you're at the store or on-the-go!



**New York Times:** Enjoy unlimited, complimentary access to the New York Times on the web or through the NYTimes app. Access can be from anywhere, from any device. When you're at the library simply log in to your NYT account (it's free to create) for unlimited access. Outside the library, use a remote pass that is good for unlimited access for a 72-hour period. The pass can be reused as many times as you like.


Bring your children to this very special program with acclaimed Grammy award-winning cellist Zuill Bailey. Zuill will perform a


