New to Our Local Author Collection

Angels on a Tombstone (2018) by J. F. Foran of Tiburon. A novel set in Ireland during the 1890s that traces one man's life from law school to exile to the search for meaning and involvement in the New World.

A Wild Promise: Prince William Sound (2018) by Debbie S. Miller of Belvedere and photographer Hugh Rose. Photographs and essays covering the history, people, and the fragility of this region clearly show that the pristine wilderness needs protection from rampant resource development.

Financial Services Technology: Processes, Architecture, and Solutions (2013), by Randall Duran of Tiburon. Reviews key financial services business areas, technologies, and covers current trends and emerging concerns in the financial services industry.

Healing, a Conversation: A Field Guide to Redemption (2016) by Annette Goggio of Tiburon. Part story, part self-help book, the author shines a bright light on the "mystery" of illness and healing by sharing her revelations and insights into her own illness.

Tea in the Redwoods (2018) by May Kramer of Tiburon. This satire on the manners and mores of the fictional residents of Mill Valley chronicles local happenings – a visiting guru, rehearsals for the play, a bike tour, a dog rescue, and other capers.

Time to Fly (2015) by the late Barnaby J. Howard of Tiburon. Compiled by his wife, Evelyn, this autobiography tells the story of his life, spanning five continents, and of his deep convictions regarding the themes of bias and prejudice, freedom and responsibility, wealth and tithing.


